Community Instructor Subjects: Humanities, Social Science, Science, Horticulture, and Health

The Division of Continuing Studies at the University of Victoria for many years has been offering a broad range of courses to meet the needs of community learners. This includes courses in Humanities, Social Science, Science, Horticulture, Health, and more. The Division of Continuing Studies invites community course proposals from new and returning instructors. These classes are part of non-credit programming accessed by members of the community looking to gain new knowledge, skills. Please note that while Continuing Studies offers a wide range of professional programs, community courses are intended for personal enrichment, rather than being professional development in nature. If you would like further clarification, please do not hesitate to reach out.

In order to keep our fees reasonable for our community learners, we are able to offer a rate of \$65 for each instructional hour.

Courses proposed can be offered online or in person, and during the afternoon, evening or weekend. We will consider one-off courses (2-5 hours in length), courses that run one afternoon/evening/full day per week for 2-6 weeks, or a series of related courses.

The Division of Continuing Studies is particularly interested in developing long-term relationships with instructors who have high professional standards, excellent communication skills, and a commitment to creating learning experiences immersed in adult education principles.

Preferred requirements

Applicants must be located within Canada to deliver this course and should have:

- demonstrated subject matter expertise through academic or professional background;
- excellent interpersonal, communication, and facilitation skills;
- previous teaching experience is considered an asset;
- instructional experience with adult or non-traditional learners is considered an asset.
